



Audit and Satisfaction Survey on Ear Syringing Service in ENT Special Clinic — 'Ear'

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Background

- Ear wax impaction is a common problem, Special Ear Clinic was set up in Feb 2011 to shorten waiting time for ear syringing
- Service was provided by trained ENT nurses instead of doctor
- To alleviate patient suffering due to ear wax impaction

Aim

- To assess patient satisfaction
- To assess the effectiveness of ear syringing by ENT nurses

Method:

- I. Patient anonymous questionnaires:
- 100 patients recruited (who attended special clinic from Oct 2011 to Feb 2012)
- II. Doctor assessment and evaluation
- Forms completed immediately after ear syringing
- III. Nurse interview by Associate Consultant
- Job satisfaction and problem encountered

Results

I. Patients:

- Overall satisfaction rate 97%
- Waiting time shortened to 3.6 weeks, satisfaction rate 96%

II. Doctors:

- **■** Effectiveness 95%
- Undesirable outcome (2 cases with ear canal abrasion)

III. Nurses:

- Enhanced career development
- Job satisfaction

Conclusion

- Waiting time was shortened from 12 weeks to 3.6 weeks
- Patients' overall satisfaction rate was high
- Doctors were satisfied with nurses' performance, their workload could be alleviated
- Nurses skill and job satisfaction could be enhanced
- Nurses were providing a safe and cost-effective service in ENT clinic
- Healthy patients and happy staff
