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Introduction

As the pilot scheme of 5-day work week in another surgical ward A8 received very positive feedbacks and response, all agreed to extend the scheme to ward B8

Objectives

- 1. To improve a better work-life balance and enhance the quality of nurses' family life
- 2. To improve jog satisfaction and morale
- 3. To maintain a good nursing quality of ward nurses after implementation

Methodology

- 1. Collect the information from A8 ward and other hospitals
- 2. Review B8 routine work
- 3. Collect pre-implementation staff opium survey
- 4. Pilot 5-day work week duty roster
- 5. Collect and analyze the post-implementation staff opium after trial run for 6 months
- 6. Evaluate the program

Result

1. Staff opinion survey: All staff agreed to the implementation of 5-day work week, 94% of staff agreed that 5-day work week will improve work life balance and allow more rest time. 62.5% of staff agreed that 5-day work week will increase workload 2. Average number of sick leave day/head count for nurses has been decreased by81%
