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INDEPENDENT PRACTITIONER'S ASSURANCE REPORT

Pursuant to the conditions stated in the Public Subscription Permit issued by the Social Welfare Department of the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region ("SWD"), we have been requested to report on the attached income and expenditure account of the Trust's general charitable fund raising through donation boxes, Octopus card readers and Octopus App QR codes for the period from 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023. ("the Event").

Responsibilities of the Trustees

The Trustees are responsible for preparing the attached income and expenditure account in accordance with the basis of preparation set out in note 2, setting out the gross subscriptions raised from the Event and the expenses incurred in connection with the Event, in order to comply with the conditions stated in the Public Subscription Permit issued by the SWD. This responsibility includes designing, implementing and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and presentation of the income and expenditure account so that it reflects the subscriptions raised and expenses incurred in connection with the Event and is free from material misstatement.

Our Independence and Quality Management

We have complied with the independence and other ethical requirements of the Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA"), which is founded on fundamental principles of integrity, objectivity, professional competence and due care, confidentiality and professional behavior.

The firm applies Hong Kong Standard on Quality Management 1, which requires the firm to design, implement and operate a system of quality management including policies or procedures regarding compliance with ethical requirements, professional standards and applicable legal and regulatory requirements.

Practitioner's Responsibilities

Our responsibility is to form a conclusion on the attached income and expenditure account, based on our engagement, and to report our conclusion to you.

Practitioner's Responsibilities (Continued)

We conducted our engagement in accordance with Hong Kong Standard on Assurance Engagements 3000 (Revised), Assurance Engagements Other than Audits or Reviews of Historical Financial Information and with reference to Practice Note 850 (Revised), Reporting on Flag days, General Charitable Fund-raising Activities and Solicitation of Signed Authorisation Forms Covered by Public Subscription Permits issued by the Social Welfare Department issued by the HKICPA. We have planned and performed our work to obtain limited assurance for giving our conclusion below.

The work undertaken in connection with this engagement is less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Hong Kong Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Our engagement included carrying out limited procedures for obtaining sufficient appropriate evidence to be able to draw a conclusion, such as inquiries primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters and other procedures we considered necessary. The procedures performed in a limited assurance engagement vary in nature and timing from, and are less in extent than for, a reasonable assurance engagement. Consequently, the level of assurance obtained in a limited assurance engagement is substantially lower than the assurance that would have been obtained had a reasonable assurance engagement been performed.

Inherent Limitations

Due to the nature of cash receipts and expenses relating to the Event, it was not practicable for us to determine whether the income and expenditure account and the books and records of the Trust include all transactions relating to the Event. It was impracticable for us to quantify the potential impact of this on the income and expenditure account. Accordingly, our report relates solely to the income and expenditure account prepared from transactions that have been recorded in the Trust's books and records.


Conclusion

1. PURPOSE OF THE FUND RAISING ACTIVITIES

The purpose of fund raising activities through the donation boxes, Octopus card readers and Octopus App QR codes is to raise funds for The Queen Elizabeth Hospital Charitable Trust so as to support hospital services at Queen Elizabeth Hospital.

The donation boxes, Octopus card readers and Octopus App QR codes held for the period from 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023 in Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Jordan, Kowloon under the Public Subscription Permit Number 2022/022/1 issued by Social Welfare Department.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

This income and expenditure account is made solely in relation to the donation boxes, Octopus card readers and Octopus App QR codes of the Trust for the period from 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023 in Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Jordan and do not include any other part of the operation of the Trust.

The significant accounting policies are set out below:

(a) Donations received

All donations received are collected from the donation boxes, Octopus card readers and Octopus App QR codes in Queen Elizabeth Hospital. The income is recorded in accordance with accrual basis.

(b) Expense

All expenses are accounted for on accrual basis.
