

Simon Stevens is President of UnitedHealth Europe, and visiting professor of health policy at the London School of Economics. From 1997-2004, he was the British Government's Health Policy Advisor, serving both as the Prime Minister's Health Advisor at 10 Downing Street, and as policy advisor to successive Secretaries of State for Health at the Department of Health. He previously worked as a senior executive in the UK National Health Service, including as a health authority director, general manager of a mental health service, and a group manager at Guy's & St. Thomas' university hospitals in London. His international work includes periods in Africa, South America and USA. Educated at Oxford University, Strathclyde University and Columbia University, New York, his policy interests include international health reform, strengthening the healthcare 'payer'/purchaser function, aligning incentives to promote efficiency, and improving chronic disease management across Europe.
