He was recruited to Arizona in March 2007 to serve as the founding dean of the Phoenix campus of the University of Arizona's College of Medicine, where he is also appointed Professor of Basic Medical Sciences, Professor of Medicine, and (at Arizona State University) Professor of Biomedical Informatics. In May 2008 he stepped down from his dean's role to return to the faculty. From January 2000 to March 2007 he was the Rolf A. Scholdager Professor and Chair of the Department of Biomedical Informatics at Columbia College of Physicians and Surgeons in New York City. Previously he was Professor of Medicine and of Computer Science at Stanford University (1979-2000).

His professional interests are in medical education and a broad range of interests in biomedical informatics, especially decision-support systems, integrated workstations for clinicians, and web -based information dissemination. Education and training in the field are of particular concern.
