

Biography of Dr. Francis Pik-tim MOK

Dr Mok graduated MBBS from The University of Hong Kong (HKU) in 1980 and joined the University Surgical Unit of Queen Mary Hospital in 1982. He obtained FRCS(Edin) in 1985, FRACS in 1990, FHKAM(Surg) in 1993. He pursued training in pancreatobiliary surgery in Glasgow, Scotland, under the tutelage of Professor David Carter in 1987. Dr. Mok was promoted Consultant Surgeon, Kwong Wah Hospital, in 1991, and was appointed Chief of Service, Department of Surgery and Combined Endoscopy Unit, Caritas Medical Centre, in 1995 and remained in that position till now. Dr. Mok is a general surgeon with interest in upper gastrointestinal surgery, hepatobiliary-pancreatic surgery. He has published in these fields in leading medical journals. He was ex-Chairman of the Endoscopy Chapter of the Hong Kong Society of Gastroenterology and ex-Council Member of the Hong Kong Society of Minimal Access Surgery. He is founding Council Member of the Hong Kong Society of Upper Gastrointestinal Surgeons and the Hong Kong Society of Hepatobiliary and Pancreatic Surgeons. Dr. Mok is also Honorary Clinical Associate Professor of HKU and The Chinese University of Hong Kong. He enjoys teaching medical students and was awarded Faculty Teaching Medal of HKU in 2004. He is Chairman of the Coordinating Committee (COC) of Surgery in Hospital Authority since 2005.
