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Nurses' Perceptions towards Evidence-Based Practice in Kowloon Hospital

Introduction

Evidence-based practice (EBP) is the integration of clinical expertise, patient values, and the best research evidence into the decision-making process of patient care. Activities have been planned and organized throughout recent years in Kowloon Hospital (KH) to promote EBP. To optimize the effectiveness of such activities and better respond to the training need regarding EBP among colleagues, more structured data are needed. A pilot questionnaire survey was carried out in end of 2015 with good response from staff nurses.

Objectives

1. To obtain structured data regarding the perceptions of KH nurses towards EBP in terms of own practice, attitudes, knowledge and skills;
2. To plan EBP-promoting activities according to the training needs identified via the data obtained; &
3. To monitor nurses' perception towards EBP periodically

Methodology

1. Questionnaire survey will be carried out after obtaining Ethical Approval from REC;
2. A series of focused activities will be planned according to the needs identified (e.g.: areas that scored lowest) from the survey;
3. Such focused activities will be organized and implemented accordingly in the subsequent calendar year; &
4. A post-questionnaire survey will be carried out after the series of activities have been carried out

Result

1. Data analysis will be carried out after data collection to look for correlation among variables; &
2. Scores in questions that scored lowest in previous survey will improve, reflecting the effect of focused activities
