







Proposed Project Scope of QMH Redevelopment Project Phase I








Road Widening Works



During road widening works, temporary traffic control arrangement would be available to ensure the traffic flow is unimpeded.

Large construction vehicles would not pass along the steep road between Royalton and Radcliffe.




Major Improvement / Benefits of New Block


- The New Block:
 - provides additional space to meet operational needs
 - adaptable to service developments
 - promotes integrated research and education
 - the following essential services would be available:
 - A&E Department
 - Peri-operative Centre
 - Diagnostic Radiology Department
 - Intensive Care Unit
 - Cardiac Catheterization Laboratories
 - In-patient Wards
 - A rooftop helipad:
 - provided in the New Block at QMH subject to the approval under the Environmental Impact Assessment Ordinance
 - enhances the overall efficiency and effectiveness of the emergency response services
 - covers primarily the outlying islands.
