

# Stage 1 Senior Staff Quarters (SSQ) Conversion Works



#### Senior Staff Quarters (SSQ) Conversion Works

- The SSQ conversion and associated works are generally on schedule.
- The widening works of Road D are substantially completed.
- The width of the carriageway has been increased by over 50% which allows two-way traffic of construction vehicles.
- QMH will continue to monitor the vehicular flow at Road D.

AFTER Road Widening Works









# Stage 2 Preparatory Works for Construction of New Block



#### 1. Proposed Rooftop Helipad

- An application for environmental impact assessment (EIA) study brief on "A Rooftop Helipad at the Proposed New Block of Queen Mary Hospital" has been submitted by the Food and Health Bureau.
- The application was advertised on 18 February 2015 for public consultation.
- The EIA study brief would be issued by the Environmental Protection Department in April 2015.
- The EIA report is expected to be submitted by Q4 2015.








#### 2. Footpath leading from Pok Fu Lam Road to Kotewall Road


- A segment of the existing footpath within the site would be cut off during the construction stage of the New Block.
- In view of public concerns, QMH would liaise with the relevant government departments to explore the possibility of re-routing the path.





#### 3. Land Exchange

- The University of Hong Kong has agreed in principle to surrender back to the Government the Rural Building Lot No. 722
   (existing School of Pathology Building) in exchange for a grant of the land at No. 3 Sassoon Road (existing QMH store).
- To allay the concerns raised about pedestrian safety, the University has agreed to extend the existing footbridge connecting Pok Fu Lam Road to Sassoon Road.
