**Progress Report on Queen Mary Hospital Redevelopment Project**

**Purpose**

This paper aims to brief members on the progress of the Queen Mary Hospital (QMH) Redevelopment, phase 1.

**Progress Update**

**A. Senior Staff Quarters (SSQ) Conversion Works**

2. Conversion works of SSQ is approaching completion. The associated relocation works are generally on schedule. As at June 2017, Electron Microscope Unit (HKU), Hepatology Research Laboratory (HKU), Department of Microbiology (QMH) and Supporting Services Section of Administrative Services Department (QMH) have moved into Block T and commenced service.

3. The footpath next to Pokfulam Conduit has been temporarily closed due to the SSQ conversion works and is expected to be reopened in 3Q 2017 .

**Report on Incidents and Feedbacks**

4. There is no incident reported and feedback encountered during the reporting period from April to July 2017.

## **B. Preparatory Works for the Construction of the New Block**

5. To alleviate the noise impact caused by construction, installation of double-glazed windows in Block K is completed and installation works at Block J are expected to be completed in 4Q 2017.

6. The New Block will have large floor plates with convenient connections between the Accident and Emergency Department, Operation Theatres and emergency diagnostic facilities, etc. so as to strengthen emergency services for critical patients. Preparation for the tender documents for construction works is almost completed. Invitation of tender is expected to be issued in 4Q 2017.

## **C. Community Newsletter and Internet Website for the QMH Redevelopment Project**
